Japhet School Students Make Craft Kits, Write Cards to Veterans, Decorate Cups for Kenya School on Family Service Night

Clawson, Michigan - During a special night for the school's community, Japhet School families, teachers, and friends engaged in an evening of service to others.

Family Service Night is a longstanding tradition at this award-winning school in Clawson, where academics and characters are equals in the classroom. Service to others is an integral part of the school's philosophy. This year's Spaghetti Supper & Family Service Night took place on Thursday, November 9.

The school's 7th- and 8th-graders, with leadership from Life Skills teacher Robin Pospisil, first cooked and served a spaghetti supper. Right after dinner, classrooms opened with service projects. While the community looks forward to savoring the housemade meat and veggie sauce and hot garlic bread every year, each year's service focus is different.

Japhet School staff and the school's Kids for Peace chapter organized three service activities, all with supplies donated from families or purchased by Kids for Peace: No-Sew Bunny & Snowman Craft Kits for children to make themselves while admitted to William Beaumont Children's Hospital, greeting and get-well cards for hospitalized veterans, and re-usable cups individually decorated for children attending the Kids for Peace School of Kenya. Japhet School's Kids for Peace chapter also purchased spoons, forks, and jump ropes for the Kenya school.

"My favorite part of Family Service Night was making the cups," said Sofia Shields, a Japhet School 2nd-grader from Royal Oak. "I was thinking how happy they will be when they get their own cups."

"Service is important to do because it helps you feel what others might be feeling," explained Esme Marcellini, a Japhet 1st-grader from Ferndale. "I liked making the bunny kits for other children."

Japhet School was founded almost 45 years ago and operates under 10 principles based on learning and ethical decision-making. The 6th principle, "With the gift of knowledge and the understanding of moral and spiritual values comes an obligation to help mankind," is the foundation for Family Service Night.
