

Are You Choosing a Preschool or Kindergarten for Your Child? Important Questions to Ask:

- 1. Does your school have a teaching philosophy for Early Childhood education?
- 2. Are there half- and full-day options? May I choose my child's days?
- 3. How many children are in attendance at any given time? What is the ratio of teachers to students? Are assistants trained teachers or parent volunteers?
- 4. What themes are explored? How often do thematic learning and discovery centers change?
- 5. How are children encouraged to express indepedence?
- 6. Do children have unstructured play time when they can explore and learn on their own and play with others?
- 7. Do children have one-on-one time with teachers regularly?
- 8. How are reading and math skills developed?
- 9. How are conflicts among children handled?
- 10. Do children have special classes outside the main room, such as a second language or music?
- 11. How are gross motor skills developed? Do children have access to a full gymnasium and a safe playground? How often do they visit the gym and/or playground?
- 12. Does your school teach character qualities as part of the curriculum (such as respect for self and others, gratitude, and peace)?
- 13. Does your school provide an extended-day program (before- and after-school care, also known as latchkey)?
