The 2011/2012 school year is off to a strong start, with five new faculty and staff members, new classroom settings, and increased enrollment to 85 students!



Upper Class has moved into the centrally located multipurpose room. UC students' classroom layout includes a touch-sensitive SmartBoard, comfortable spaces for reading and listening (pictured), laptop computers, and separate areas to write and collaborate.



Intermediate and Upper Class students made their annual trek to the Leelanau Outdoor Center, which included physical challenges and team-building initiatives. The lessons learned at LOC prepare them for a peaceful and cooperative year together.



September 21 was International Peace Day. All Japhet students planted their "Pinwheels for Peace" outside the school with drawings and words about peace. Before planting, Art teacher Marti Minard read a peace poem and asked students to pause for a quiet moment for reflection.



Middle Class students began their science studies by working in pairs to investigate fallen leaves with black spots on them. They recorded their observations based on sight, smell, and touch, then went for a walk around Japhet to seek out more trees with similar leaves.
