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A Letter from the Head of School

Japhet School's motto is "strength for the future." To provide strength for the future of Japhet we have actively been working on our Strategic Plan.



In May 2007, the Japhet School Board of Trustees voted to endorse a **Strategic Plan** that reflected the participation and collective vision of members of the Japhet School community. Since then strategic coordinators and committee members have defined action steps for each of the specific strategies, and they created a five-year calendar for completing them. Strategies include Marketing, Student Retention, Scholarship Fund, Alumni Relationships, Diversification, Relocation, Compensation, Fundraising, Grant Writing, New Resources, Tuition, and Curriculum Best Practices.

In March 2008, participants from the April 2007 Strategic Planning Workshop will gather to discuss our first-year progress and implementation. Here are a few highlights:

- The main goal of the Scholarship Fund strategy is to raise additional scholarship funds. In support of this strategy we have reinstated Japhet's golf outing "Fore the Kids." This event helped raise an additional \$5,000 for scholarships this year.
- Implementation of Best Practices includes the forming of academic committees, reviewing standardized testing results, and reevaluating the scope and sequence of Middle School Math so that Japhet eighth-grade students have an exposure to Algebra I. I am pleased to report that all eighth-grade students are working in Algebra I or higher. Adjustments to our math curriculum have been made to continue to provide Algebra I to all future eighth-grade students.
- The Alumni Relations committee has met its objective of having an alumni column in each newsletter since the adoption of the Strategic Plan. The committee also is planning an Alumni Reunion for June 2008.

Within the next year, you may be asked to complete a survey related to one or more of these strategies. If you are interested in receiving a copy of Japhet's Strategic Plan or a summary of our first-year progress and implementation report, please contact me.
